## **District Administrator Report**

- Prior to Christmas break, we had a great turnout for the music programs. We had three programs with K-2 grades, 3-5 grades and 6-12 grades. Thank you to the teachers, staff and students for a well-done job celebrating the holiday season.
- After our November meeting, I have taken on some of the educator effectiveness observations and reporting for Ms. Wessman, so she has more time to devote to reading plans in the elementary school.
- The first semester will end this Friday, January 17, 2025. Grades will be out sometime next week.
- This is the time of year where we have our second set of Aimsweb assessments for our students to comply with Act 20. Along with these assessments, teachers in the elementary school will need to look at student growth and, for some students, prepare reading plans that will address any students who are behind in their skills at this point. The third assessment for Aimsweb will be in March.
- This is the time of year where we have a long period of time before we have any extended days off. I always have said that this I the prime time for teaching and learning, and it is important for both students and staff to be here during this time so they can progress in their learning through this time.
- We have had two board members put in for their candidacy for the April 1, 2025 election and one filed non-candidacy papers. So this election will have only two candidates and then the board will need to appoint a new board member, or an existing one to take the position for one year.

## **Elementary Principal's Report**

- Elementary students had an assembly on January 6 to roll out the character trait of positivity. The students participated in a song and dance that highlighted how to be positive in different circumstances.
- We are in our aimswebPlus Winter testing window. First grade completed the literacy component last week with testing proctors. I will assist proctoring kindergarten literacy testing this week. The elementary testing window will be completed January 21 st.
- 4K Raider Round Up will be held on March 14. We have 18 students registering thus far and six of them would be open enrollment students.
- Field Trips: Fifth grade went to Beaver Creek on January. This was completely paid for through a grant. Upcoming Christie Mountain Trips:

January 3 rd and 4 th grade, fifth grade January 24 and 31. On the 16 th students will learn basic fundamentals how-to put-on ski boots during phy ed.

- 2 student teachers will be starting on January 20 th Emma Nawrocki from UW River Falls in second grade with Karlie Kopras and Jeannette Kottke from UW Superior in third grade with Bethany Cooley.
- Math after school group will begin on January 21 for fourth grade on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Madyson Clark and Kim Schueller will be helping. Once this is established, we hope to move to third grade. There just isn't enough staff to assist with this program.
