•	Building Background Knowledge
	I've been spending a lot of time getting to know the people and the community including touring with Bob Lowkorski, spending time in the coffee shop and trying to get a sense of all of the community resources available here in Bruce.
	☐ The past couple of weeks have been focused on the referendum, better understanding our insurance policies and meeting with the different providers, building a Salary Schedule so that we can approve an increase for staff and trying to get a handle on our building schedules so that we can understand our staffing challenges and opportunities as well as how students move throughout their school day, etc.
	☐ We completed the 2025 - 2026 calendar and ensured that we have our minutes comply with DPI regulations. We will share that calendar with families this week.
•	Establish the District Leadership Team
	□ We held our first District Leadership Team meeting and are really building a sense of shared ownership and creating some systems and structures for how we operate as a district. The team is eager to build our vision and help our teachers, families and students really understand where we'd like to go over the next several years.
•	Understanding our Staffing needs and create systems for building the annual budget
	☐ This goes back to our scheduling timeline and practices here in Bruce which need some attention. Typically the expectation is that scheduling be completed early so that we understand exactly how many sections we have and how many

Full Time Equivalencies (FTE) we need. We are working through that process

right now to make sure that we are adequately staffed.

# **Elementary Principal's Report**

I am incredibly excited to join the Bruce School District and become part of a community that clearly values its students, staff, and school pride. In just a short time, it's been easy to see how much Bruce cares about creating positive experiences for kids, and I look forward to supporting that tradition while building strong relationships with our students, families, and staff.

By way of introduction, I bring 12 years of experience in education.
