ANNUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING MINUTES, OCTOBER 26, 2020

The annual School District of Bruce board meeting was called to order by Board President Daniel Robers at 6:30 p.m. Anderson, Kempen, Robers, Trott and Vohs were present. Golat and Schweitzer-Hopkins were absent.

An affirmation of public notice was made.

A nomination was made by Andrew Anderson to elect Daniel Robers as chairperson. The clerk declared unanimous ballot be cast for Daniel Robers as chairperson of the annual meeting.

Whitney Trott will act as clerk of the meeting.

The minutes of the October 21, 2019 annual meeting were approved at the conclusion of that meeting.

A Treasurer's report was given by Daniel Kempen. A motion was made by Andrea Vohs that the treasurer's report be accepted, seconded by Andrew Anderson. Motion carried.

The 2020-2021 budget was presented by Patrick Sturzl, District Administrator.

There was a consideration of the <u>proposed</u> tax levy for 2020-2021. The board has determined that a tax levy of not less than \$2,676,070 is necessary to operate the school district for the 2020-2021 school year. In addition \$40,000 is for community service activities. It is understood that certification of the 2020 equalized valuation for the district in October 2020 will determine the mill rate and that the school board has a statutory duty to determine and levy the amount of tax necessary on or before November 1. A motion was made by Mike Robers that a proposed total tax of not less than \$2,716,070 be levied against the school district equalized value for the 2020-2021 school year. Second was made by Mark Zimmer. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mike Robers seconded by Mark Zimmer that the board salaries be increased to President \$1400, Clerk \$1600, Treasurer \$1400 and Directors \$1200. Special meeting compensation will be \$60 for officers and \$45 for directors. Full day meetings or conventions will be \$70.00. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mark Zimmer, seconded by Mike Robers that the school board be authorized, during the current school year, to sell and dispose of any tangible personal property belonging to the school district that is no longer needed for school purposes, provided, however, that the maximum aggregate value of such tangible personal property disposed of during the current school year shall not exceed a \$6,000 value as evidenced by the competitive bidding procedures. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Andrew Anderson and seconded by Mike Robers to approve the lunch and milk prices as recommended. Adult lunch remain at \$4.20 per meal. 4K-5 lunches will be free due to the Federal CEP program, grades 6-12 will be \$2.60 and Reduced remains the same at 40 cents. Adult breakfast meals remain at \$1.85, students 4K-5 will be free due to the Federal CEP program, students in grades 6-12 be \$1.20 and reduced remains the same at 30 cents. The price of a ½ pint milk remains at 30 cents. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mark Zimmer with a second by Mike Robers that the Wisconsin State Pooled Investment Fund serve as the district's short term and capital projects investment agency. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mike Robers and seconded by Mark Zimmer that the board be authorized to let out bids for salvage and light cut of school forests with a competitive bid based on specifications from a consulting forester. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mike Robers and seconded by Mark Zimmer Pursuant to §120.10(5m), Wis. Stat., to authorize the School Board to acquire the following real estate: A 40-acre wooded parcel, identified as Parcel No. 026-00364-0000, Town of Murry, Rusk County, from Kurt Mertens. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Whitney Trott and seconded by Mike Robers that the school be authorized to continue the accident insurance for students in school district programs. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Andy Anderson with a second from Mike Robers that the board be authorized to set a date of October 25 as the 2021 Annual Meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mike Robers with a second from Mike Robers that the 2020 annual board minutes be approved. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mark Zimmer with a second by Mike Robers that the 2020 annual meeting be adjourned at 7:22 p.m. Motion carried.

GREAT STUDENTS GREAT STAFF GREAT EXPECTATIONS

From the District Administrator, Pat Sturzl

We had a great start to the new school year. All of the students I have talked to since school started are happy to be back five days a week! We have no new initiatives this year except to return to normal. I am looking forward to the day when COVID and quarantines are no longer part of our lives. Hopefully that day is soon.

There are several new staff this year. We have four new teachers in the elementary. Jenna Warren is teaching kindergarten, Cassidy Irwin is teaching 3rd grade, Chassity Johnson is teaching 4th grade, and Anna Bischel is teaching 5th grade. There are two new special education teachers. Ronda Acuna is teaching elementary special education and Justin Lauber is teaching high school special education. In high school, there are four new teachers. Ross Weinert is teaching English, Kelsey Anderson is teaching Business Education, Renee Grambo is teaching math and science, and Cassie Sutten is teaching family and consumer education. Three more new teachers I need to mention are Carlie Crotteau who is teaching physical education, Angie Tetner who is an elementary interventionist, and Logan Kaduce who is teaching elementary and middle school music education. Let's give a friendly welcome to the new staff.

The high school students adjusted well to the six-period day with one-hour classes. The extended class periods allow students and teachers to dig deeper into their topics. The longer class periods allow teachers to guide instruction, assist students to comprehend the lesson, or to extend the lesson for a greater understanding of the topic. In addition, the six-period day provides flexibility for scheduling students into technical college or college level courses. Advanced technical college and college level courses prepare our students for success after high school graduation.

The district will continue to provide free breakfast and lunch to students this year. The federal program providing meals for students is called the Seamless Summer Option (SSO). The free student meals will continue for the entire school year. Every student meal served is reimbursed by the federal government. Looking ahead to fall of 2022, The Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) will continue in the district. The CEP program provides free breakfast and lunch to all elementary students. The federal programs allow families to save money

The State of Wisconsin's 2021 – 2023 biennial budget was signed into law early in July. The state budget provides little new revenue to school districts. The majority of school funding from the state is designated for additional general aid to school districts. The additional aid will lower property taxes. This year will be the lowest mill rate since I have been the district administrator. All school districts in America received a significant amount of federal funding due to the pandemic. The Bruce School District received nearly \$1.9 million from the federal government. The federal funding allows the district to provide staff who help students catch-up for time out of school, increase technology in school, and maintain the school building. The federal funding extends through September 2023.

High academic achievement is always our goal. The School Board, Administration, and Staff are committed to make our district a place that students want to come to learn and where parents want to send their children. Thank you for supporting the students of the School District of Bruce.

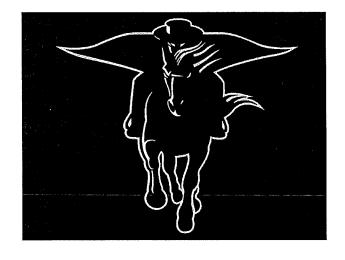
